RESOLUTION OF THE
TSAILE/WHEATFIELDS CHAPTER #038

SUPPORTING THE COMPLETION OF A RURAL ADDRESSING SYSTEM AND
DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A NAVAJO NATION ENHANCED
EMERGENCY 9-1-1 SYSTEM.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJ-20-55, dated December 2, 1955, the Tsaille/Wheatfields Chapter is vested with authority and charged with responsibility to promote, protect and preserve the interest and general welfare, including health and safety of its community people; and
2. The Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-638) of the U.S. Congress and Local Governance Initiatives entitles and supports us, Navajo Indians, in initiating plans and making decisions, recommendation, request, etc., according to our actual needs and desires; and
3. The Tsaille/Wheatfields Chapter is aware of the need for a Navajo Nation Wide Enhanced Emergency 9-1-1 System for any sudden occurrences of emergencies and recognizes the lack of an effective emergency response; and
4. The Tsaille/Wheatfields Chapter acknowledges the need for establishment of an Enhances Emergency 9-1-1 System on the Navajo Nation, to improve adequate communications and expedite emergency services; and
5. Furthermore, the Tsaille/Wheatfields Chapter genuinely believes those communities within Navajo Nation will not only benefit the people, but also public businesses, health care facilities, educational institutions, fire districts, emergency rescue personnel and police district.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:


