The Low Mountain Chapter hereby respectfully submits its support and endorsement in the implementation of a Rural Addressing System, and subsequently, a Navajo Nation Enhanced Emergency 9-1-1 System, an effort through the Communications and Utilities Department of the Navajo Division of General Services.
