

- 1. Pursuant to 2 NNC § 4001 & 4006, and Resolution CMY-23-79, the Oak Springs Chapter is a certified chapter of the Navajo Nation and is delegated the responsibility to act for and on behalf of its community and community members; and
- 2. The Oak Springs Chapter is aware of the need for a Navajo Nation-wide Enhanced Emergency 9-1-1 System for any sudden occurrences of emergencies and recognizes the lack of an effective emergency responses; and
- 3. The Oak Springs Chapter acknowledges the need for establishment of an Enhanced Emergency 9-1-1 on the Navajo Nation, to improve adequate communications and expedite emergency services; and
- 4. It is in the best interest of the Oak & Pine Springs constituents to support this resolution on behalf of their young preschoolers, their parents and their communities.
